Children's University

Ashlawn School supports the Children's University and currently has a group of ten year 8 students following the learning experiences that the CU offers. They experience learning both in and out of school hours and earn stamps in their passports to help them on their way to graduation.

In November, our students were given the opportunity of helping to host the annual graduation ceremony for Coventry and Warwickshire. Five of them took up the challenge and, rather than merely assisting, they asked to plan and host the ceremony themselves!

As a result of their superb hosting of the graduation, Kian and Georgia have been invited to the 5th Anniversary Celebration of the CU at the House of Lords in January. The Chief Executive, Ger Graus, has also said that he would like to come and have lunch with all the students in the New Year.

What is Children's University?

Students get together and show each other what they have learnt recently after school, during the weekend and in the holidays.

As evidence of what you have learnt and what place you have recently been to, you could bring photos, leaflets or objects to the meeting.

You get passport stamps for whatever you have done which is interesting or is relevant.

Some students have already given presentations in a few meetings. Ryan Evans has given a presentation on Raptors (birds of prey). Sean Huxley has given us a presentation on science and Kian Saville has given a presentation on swimming.

Sporting Achievements

So far it has been successful start to the sporting season with over 30 boys rugby and football fixtures being played and winning a total of 20 these. 25 netball fixtures have also been played this term, with the girls totaling 20 wins so far! A fantastic start to the 2012-2013 season.

Highlights include:

- The Year 8 and Year 10 football teams reaching the Semi-Finals of the County Cup.
- Year 9 & 10 Rugby teams remain unbeaten with some outstanding performances. Notable performances to date include Year 9 beating Avon Valley 42-0 and Year 10 beating Bilton 40-5.
- Six students in Year 9 and three students in Year 10 have been selected to represent Rugby District U14 and U15.
- U14 Rugby District Students: Tom Bailie (Captain), Liam Smith, Adam Manning, Charlie Whiteside, Sam Lockley, Zach Wright.
- U15 Rugby District Students: Sam Elliot and Liam Deery. Sam has progressed up the ranks and is now a Warwickshire COUNTY player!
- Lyle Sargent (Year 8) was selected to run cross country for Warwickshire in the U14 English schools championships.
- The year 7, 9 and 10 girls finishing in runners up place in the district netball league, with the year 8 and 11 teams winning overall to be district champions!
- The year 9 boys and girls teams, and 11 girls team, have all reached the Warwickshire County finals in badminton, convincingly beating all other district teams including Rugby School and Princethorpe College.
- Year 9 girls football team beat RHS 11-1, to move on to the next round in the U14 county cup.







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Aspiring Students

Gifted and Talented Ashlawn students and their parents spent an evening learning about how to apply to the UK's most prestigious universities.

A visiting member of Keble College, Oxford, Ms Boriana Boneva, explained to students why Oxbridge was the ideal destination for them after 6th form. The students were many of Ashlawn's highest attaining Y11s, all predicted to reach between an impressive 5 and 10 A*s and As in their GCSEs.

After a short presentation on the advantages of studying at Oxford or Cambridge, students and parents then practised a range of difficult subject questions in the style of the infamous "Oxbridge Interview"! Ms Boneva helped parents and children with some of the more complex challenges!

Jude Hunton, Ashlawn's lead teacher for G&T sad: "It is important to recognise we have so many hard



working, high achieving students who should see Oxbridge and other top universities as the right destination for them after sixth form. Over the last three years Ashlawn has sent more and more young

people from our 6th form to top universities and we will play our part in the community ensuring this continues."
