Entertainment at the event was provided by Wakefield College Dance students who performed an extract from their hit show Dancing Daughters, and Cathedral Academy of Performing Arts who performed a piece from Les Miserables.




Here's to the next event and our next group of children achieving the Gold Award...

# School Focus on.... Normanton All Saints

There's always an interesting after-school club going on at Normanton All Saints Infant School. When we dropped in to speak with the school's CU Coordinator Danielle Edwards, it was a Thursday night and Pet Club, where 15 children were engrossed in the after-school activity and were listening intently to 7 year old Cayden Atack holding and talking about his polecats.

Cayden, pictured with his mum and Danielle Edwards, explained to the class how to care for the animal's, what they eat and how much pleasure he derives from looking after his pets. Other 'guests' at Pet Club have included dogs, cats and even a tarantula!





The school offers a range of after-school clubs which run every Tuesday to Friday on a termly basis and range from traditional activities such as sports classes to art and crafts to the new Pets Club – all of which are driven by the children.

Danielle Edwards said: "We are proud to be associated with the CU as it helps us to reinforce the school's philosophy of learning outside the classroom. We offer our children lots of after-school clubs and have noticed that since joining the CU, lots of children and families have been inspired to attend the sessions, so much so that many are oversubscribed. We had 90 children wanting to attend Pet Club!

Being part of the CU and the passports have helped us raise the profile of our after-school provision. Our children are always asking about activities and suggesting new clubs, and we find their eagerness to learn new things also comes out in their school studies."


The Wakefield CU website:
