Join University of York postgraduate students for this year's Festival Fringe Family Fun afternoon. Discover the hidden world of fungi, the Normans, medieval maps and more.

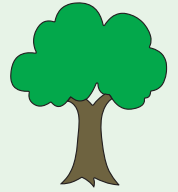
