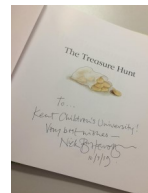
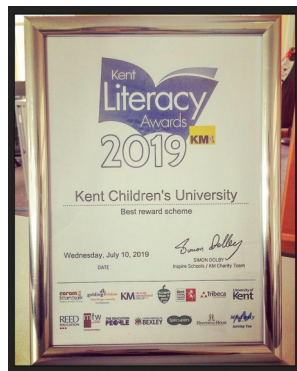
We have some rather lovely new to share with you!
